

Our Clubhouse Rules and Dress Code are in line with the traditions of the club. They have been put in place to ensure that standards of dress and behaviour in the clubhouse and on the course are kept as high as possible. We are sure that they will be appreciated by all who enjoy our facilities.

To make everyone's visit more enjoyable please adhere to the following Clubhouse Rules:

- The Clubhouse is not open to the public. Only Members and their guests are permitted to use the Clubhouse.
- Members are welcome to sign guests into the clubhouse. Please use the member's guest book at the bar. A guest may only visit the club a maximum of six times in one calendar year.
- All members must ensure their guests comply with the rules of Maesdu Golf Club.
- Your membership swipe card may be required as proof of membership.
- Alcohol must only be consumed on the premises or on the patio.
- Smoking and vapouring is not permitted in the clubhouse.
- Please ensure your mobile phone is switched to silent mode and refrain from making or taking calls in the lounge, bar and dining room.
- Children are welcome in the Clubhouse until 9pm. If attending a function they may stay after 9pm as long as they are accompanied by an adult.
- Only food and beverages purchased from the club may be consumed on the premises.
- Dogs are not allowed in the clubhouse (except for guide dogs).
- The club does not accept any responsibly for any vehicles or contents left on the carpark or items left in the clubhouse

Dress Code in the Clubhouse

All members and visitors must have a reasonable standard of dress in the Clubhouse. The general dress code is 'smart casual' with further restrictions as noted below. If there is a function a change in dress code will be advised. Any person improperly dressed will be informed politely by a staff or committee member and will be requested to dress in accordance with the club's dress rules. If in doubt, please ask the bar staff or any committee member.

- Dress at all times must be clean
- Outdoor coats and jackets should be hung in the hallway
- Working overalls are not permitted
- Smart jeans or denims (not ripped) may be worn
- T shirts must not be emblazoned with anything that can be construed as offensive
- Hats or caps are not permitted
- Golf clothing may be worn. No spiked golf shoes are permitted.
- Sleeveless vests are not permitted.
